For users with visual impairment the EZ Access keypad often provides the most effective method of interaction with menu driven applications. This level of accessibility is not provided by the primarily visual interface offered by touch screens alone.

The EZ Access keypad concept originated from research programs carried out by The <u>Trace</u>

<u>Research Department</u> at the University of

Wisconsin. Using highly tactile press buttons of distinctive shapes and colors, the keypads are ideal for use in unattended, interactive kiosk deployments. The shapes and colors selected were those proven to be most easily identifiable by both sight and touch. Spacing of the buttons is such that they can also be used by people who have pronounced tremor or difficulty with reach and motion.
