
V_{CE}, COLLECTOR-EMITTER VOLTAGE (V) Figure 6. Typical Capacitance



Figure 8. Typical Gate Charge







Figure 9. Switching Loss vs. Temperature

Figure 10. Switching Time vs. Temperature






Figure 11. Switching Loss vs. I_C




Figure 13. Switching Loss vs. Rg




Figure 14. Switching Time vs. Rg




Figure 15. Switching Loss vs. V_{CE}




Figure 16. Switching Time vs. V_{CE}




Figure 17. Safe Operating Area




Figure 18. Reverse Bias Safe Operating Area




Figure 19. IGBT Transient Thermal Impedance




Figure 20. Diode Transient Thermal Impedance




Figure 21. Test Circuit for Switching Characteristics




Figure 22. Definition of Turn On Waveform





Figure 23. Definition of Turn Off Waveform


