






Figure 7. Diode Forward Characteristics




Figure 8. Typical Gate Charge




Figure 9. Switching Loss vs. Temperature




Figure 10. Switching Time vs. Temperature




Figure 11. Switching Loss vs. I<sub>C</sub>




Figure 12. Switching Time vs. I<sub>C</sub>




Figure 13. Switching Loss vs. Rg




Figure 14. Switching Time vs. Rg




Figure 15. Switching Loss vs. V<sub>CE</sub>




Figure 16. Switching Time vs. V<sub>CE</sub>




Figure 17. Safe Operating Area




Figure 18. Reverse Bias Safe Operating Area




Figure 19. IGBT Die Self-heating Square-wave Duty Cycle Transient Thermal Response





Figure 20. Diode Die Self-heating Square-wave Duty Cycle Transient Thermal Response






Figure 21. Test Circuit for Switching Characteristics




Figure 22. Definition of Turn On Waveform

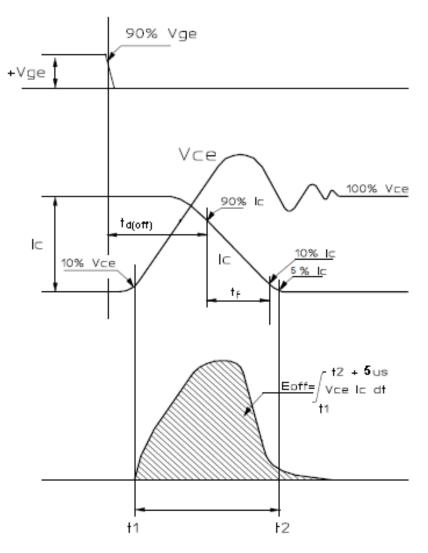





Figure 23. Definition of Turn Off Waveform
